Rachel facilitated Ruby's intake and spent much time listening to Jane's reasons for surrendering her beloved cat. Most of the problem centered around the heavy weight of Ruby's cat litter and Jane's limited mobility in her multi-story home. Rachel could see the heartache on her face and suggested alternatives, however Jane remained unconvinced that she could provide the best care for Ruby and so decided to put her up for adoption.

But Ruby's story doesn't end there...Jane continued to visit Ruby at the shelter. During our Valentine Heart Vote promotion, Jane bought 100 hearts in hopes that Ruby would be selected as Pet of the Week and find a new caring home quickly.

Seeing the love and devotion that Jane had for her cat, Rachel was even more determined to find a way to keep them together. She researched the new lighter weight brand of litters, even purchasing

them and trying them out on her own cats first. Rachel knew in her heart that one way or another, these two had to stay together.

In the end, with compassion and real solutions,

Rachel worked with Jane so that she could find new ways to adequately care for Ruby. With the new lighter-weight litter and containers to carry smaller quantities of litter up and down the stairs, Jane was now confident she could continue to properly care for Ruby.

Thanks to Rachel and MHS, Ruby is back home. Turns out her journey to find the best home brought her right back to her forever home and the woman who loved her so much that she was willing to let her go.

MHS PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

First, there was The Olympic Games. Then ... The Daycare Games!

Sponsored by The Dog Gurus, an on-line safe off-leash play resource that was founded in 2013, The Daycare Games ran during the month of February and MHS Daycare competed against 14 other medium-class daycare facilities.



There are 3 events in the Games: Dog Recall, Group Sits, and Managing the Gate Boundary. With Dog Recall, each staff calls the dogs from the playgroup one

at a time and is scored on the percentage of dogs who come to be petted within 3 seconds. The Group Sit is scored by the percentage of dogs who sit on the cue at the same time and hold the sit for 2-4 seconds. The last event is the most challenging—the Gate Boundary. Scores are based upon the number of dogs that the handler can have waiting calmly at least 3 feet away from the gate and how far the gate can be open while doing this.

MHS is pleased and proud to announce that we won a total of NINE medals across all three events with three staff! 6 gold medals, 2 silver, and one bronze! A round of a-paws for our great Daycare team!
